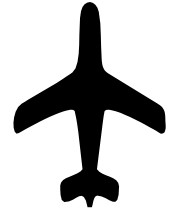

# **THE ORGANIZATION OF BLACK AIRLINE PILOTS, INC. ACE ACADEMY PROGRAM**

The Organization of Black Airline Pilots, Inc. (OBAP) Aviation Career Education (ACE) Academy Program is a nationally recognized program. OBAP is partnered along with the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), National Black Coalition of Federal Aviation Employees (NBCFAE), military, commercial and non-profit community organizations in pursuit of the goals and objectives of this program.

The objective of Ace Academy is to offer entry-level exposure of the aviation industry to young people ages 12 to 17. The number of students (per class) will tend to vary each year, but should average between 15 to 40 students. Following is a list of common activities, objectives, and goals for the students attending Ace Academy.

## **Activities**

- **Aircraft orientation flights (powered aircraft)**
- **Field trips to educational and commercial facilities specializing in aviation**
- **Visits to aviation museums**
- **FAA and Air Traffic Control related facilities**
- **Aviation career seminars where young people can hear from Aviation and Aeronautical Professionals about how to get started in building an aviation career**

## **OBJECTIVES**

- 1. To give students an awareness of the role of aviation in modern history and of the many contributions made by minorities.**
- 2. To discuss, identify, and understand the basic principles of flight.**
- 3. To help students understand the importance of education and how it relates to different aviation careers.**
- 4. To encourage students to explore career opportunities in the field of aviation with a focus on flying careers.**
- 5. To provide an introductory/demonstration flight for students so they can experience the joy of flight.**

## **APPLICATION DEADLINE – 1 APR 09**

Each student will receive notification of their status by email or letter, along with further instructions. Alternate students will be called if slots are available.

- 3) Students applying for the Advanced Academy
